

## AUTHOR INFORMATION

### *Revista Enfoques: Ciencia Política y Administración Pública*

The Revista Enfoques journal is a twice yearly publication from the Faculty of Political Science and Public Administration of the Universidad Central de Chile, whose aim is to disseminate original research papers, research developments, essays and literature reviews, in the field of Political Science, Public Policy, Public Management and Political Philosophy.

Original works are keenly received either in English, Spanish or Portuguese, providing that it has not also been submitted elsewhere for publication. Revista Enfoques journal will acknowledge receipt of all documents within 30 days from reception.

The Editorial Board will decide whether to publish the papers received, not being duty bound to maintain a correspondence with the authors. The articles will be subject to expert evaluation using a double-blind system, taking into account the coherence of the work with its title and whether it follows the scientific method, the relevance and timeliness of the bibliographical sources given, the summary and abstract, the ability to make inferences, establish relationships and links to information and to draw conclusions, whether there is an appropriate use of the writing style, grammar and spelling in the language used, the originality of the work and if this is a real and significant contribution to the disciplines covered by the journal. This evaluation is anonymous and may last, at least, six months, period where the Editorial Board may have no contact with the author. The result of this evaluation will be noticed to the author and may be that the article be accepted, rejected or returned with suggestions for improvements prior to acceptance for publication. In all cases, introducing the recommendations of the experts is a mandatory condition for the article's publication, having to be expressed in the first foot note of the article the expert evaluation acknowledgement. 13) After publication, authors will receive two copies of the journal and electronic offprint of the article.

Signed articles are the sole responsibility of the authors and do not necessarily represent the opinion of the journal. For all legal purposes, the authors cede to the journal all reproduction and dissemination rights pertaining to the article. This cessions should be explicitly written in the cover letter. After this, the author must fill a form with his or her data and sign a rights cession commitment which will be electronically sent to the Editorial Board. If third parties ask for permission to

reproduce or translate whole or partial articles, the decision will be made by the Editorial Board.

The Revista Enfoques journal authorizes partial publication of published works provided the source is cited. When writing their articles, authors should follow the following guidelines:

1. One copy of the article to be submitted in Word format to [enfoques@ucen-tral.cl](mailto:enfoques@ucen-tral.cl) or [revistanenfoques.ucen@gmail.com](mailto:revistanenfoques.ucen@gmail.com). Along with the article, the author should submit a letter indicating his or her interest for the article to be published in Revista Enfoques journal and establishing that the study is not under consideration for being published in any other journal or publisher. In addition, a contact telephone and a postal address for shipping issues should be provided,
2. The article must include the title in Spanish and English, academic affiliation of the author(s), plus full name, and e-mails. Each author's academic affiliation should include full name, the department, faculty, university, city and country they belong to.
3. On the first page, as a footnote, a statement must be made as to whether this contribution is an original result arising from scientific research. Those articles that are the result of research projects funded with either public or private funds must indicate the corresponding reference name and / or number or project code, funding source and year. One may also indicate whether the work has been previously submitted to a conference or scientific meeting, and if it has obtained any awards or special mention. In the published works, or which may have been submitted to other journals as part of a longer text, a letter reporting on the event shall be included.
4. A statement of conflict of interest should be included, and if there is conflict, it should be described (if none reported, the editorial committee will judge it as non-existent).
5. Optionally, in foot page, a biography of each author, up to 500 characters, including spaces can be written. Here, information such as the most relevant academic degrees, current positions, as well as the most important publications list, can be indicated. The maximum length of articles will be up to 75,000 characters with spaces, including tables, figures and references.
6. Book reviews should be up to 10,000 characters length, including spaces. Also to be attached is a summary (in Spanish) and an abstract (in English) of the piece, not more than 1,000 characters, including spaces,, and five key words in Spanish and English.
7. The abstract and keywords should be written in good English. It is suggested that arrangements be made for it to be translated by a native speaker and to refrain from using Internet translation tools, it is precisely this summary which is loaded into databases, thus improving the impact that the article and the journal may have.

8. The major headings and sub-section shall be clear and concise. Tables and figures will have descriptive titles. All notes in the tables should indicate their source immediately below them. The column titles will clearly define the data they present. The graphs and tables will be black and white, so no color images can be accepted, an editable Excel file format must also be included, such that sizes and fonts may be adjusted according to need.
9. Regarding page format:  
The page size must be letter (8.5 x11 in)  
Upper and lower margins must be 2.5 cms. Left and right margins must be 3 cms.  
Page number must be indicated in the lower right corner.  
Body texts must be Times New Roman font, size 12, single spaced.  
Page foot texts must be Times New Roman font, size 10, single spaced.  
Bold and underlined texts in symbols, words, tables or graphs are not allowed, only Italics.  
Roman numbers and acronyms must be written in small caps.
10. Regarding citations and references :  
The American Psychological Association's sixth edition regulations are to be used (APA 6.0), which can be found in <http://flash1r.apa.org/apastyle/basics/index.htm>.  
Example: The name of the author, year of publication and page number are placed, either in the text, such as: (Department of Veterans Affairs, 2001, 2003, Derryberry & Reed, 2005a, 2005b), or as a footnote page, such as:  
Williams, J. H. (2008). Employee engagement: Improving participation in safety. Professional Safety, 53(12), 40-45.
11. All quotations from texts written in languages other than Spanish must be translated into Spanish. The author of the manuscript will decide whether to keep the quote in the original language in the article body and having the translation available as a footnote or vice versa or, alternatively, have the quote present in its translated version. The bibliography will include the name of the corresponding translator. If the author of the piece translates the quote, then this should be noted at the end of it by the words "My translation" in parentheses.
12. The expression et al. will be used to denote works compiled by more than four authors.
13. The bibliography will be included at the end of the work. The reference list is arranged alphabetically by author surname. The APA 6.0 regulations requires that book titles, magazines, encyclopedias, newspapers, etc. are denoted using italic font (or italics). Bibliographical references are to be presented in the following manner: Author, initials (year). Book title. Place of publication: Editor.

For books the following model is to be used:

Spielberger, C. D., Gorsuch, I., & Lushene, R. E. (1970). *Manual for the State-Trait Inventory*. Palo Alto, CA: Consulting Psychologists Press.

For chapters in edited books the following model will be used:

Chow, T. W., & Cummings, J. L. (2000). *The amygdala and Alzheimer's disease*. In J. P. Aggleton (Ed.), *The amygdala: A functional analysis* (pp. 656-680). Oxford, England: Oxford University Press.

For journal articles the following model is to be used:

Ohnishi, T., Matsuda, H., Tabira, T., Asada, T., & Uno, M. (2001). Changes in brain morphology in Alzheimer's disease and exaggerated aging process? *American Journal of Neuroradiology*, 22, 1680-1685.

Articles failing to comply any of the above mentioned guidelines will be rejected.
